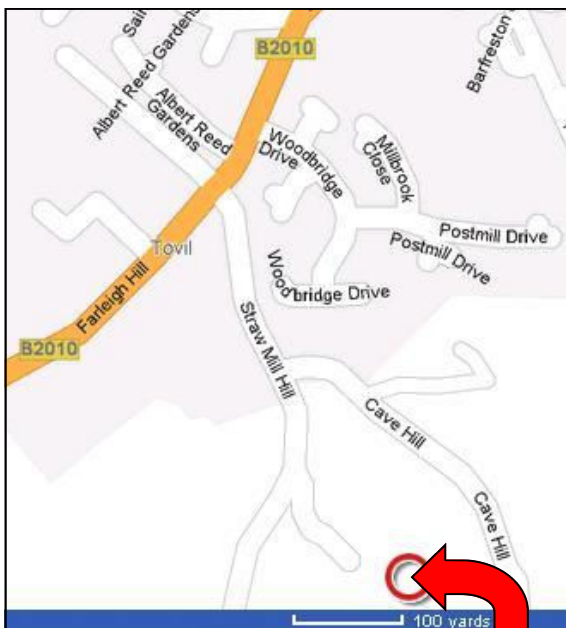

We will be having a guest speaker from the Fire Service.

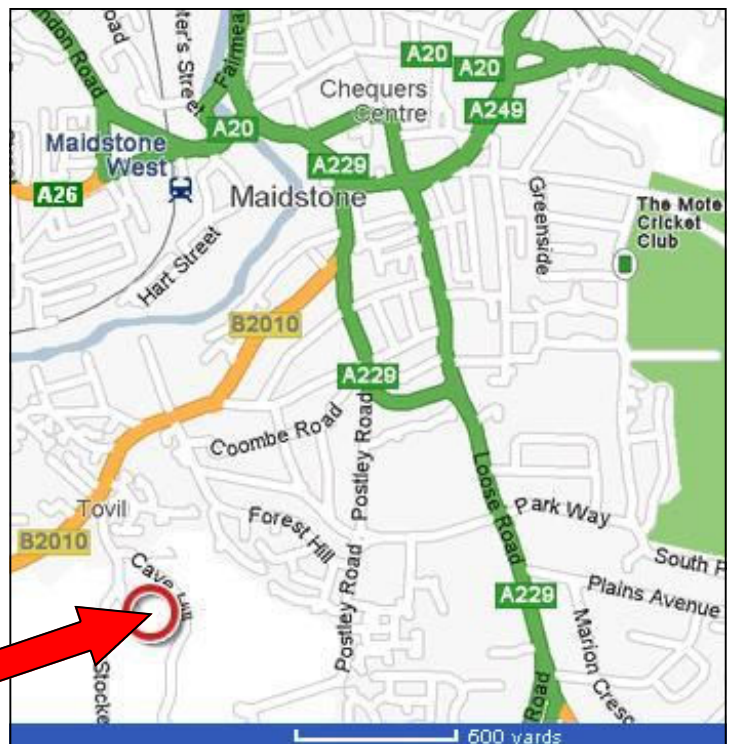
The beautiful gardens will be open to explore prior to or after the AGM.

**20 Million People
Eligible For Free Swimming**

From 1 April, children under 16 and people over 60 can enjoy free swimming at over a thousand swimming pools across England. Roughly 20 million people will be eligible for the scheme and will be allowed to use pools in other areas if their own council is not taking part. Local councils taking part are: Thanet; Shepway; Gravesham; Canterbury and Dover.

Interest in target shooting is growing rapidly. Although the governing body for able-bodied shooting, (the UIT), was founded in 1907, shooting events for athletes with physical disabilities started in Scotland in 1970.

The British Paraplegic Shooting Association was formed in 1976 to introduce shooting to people with disabilities, and in 2005 became Disability Target Shooting Great Britain (DTSGB). Disabled shooters compete in the same competitions as able-bodied competitors. Rules allow wheelchair competitors to shoot Air Rifle prone and standing whilst able-bodied competitors shoot standing only.

Shooting became a Paralympic sport in 1980, and Britain has won many shooting medals at Paralympic Games through the efforts of such stars as Di Coates and Isabel Newstead, and also Matt Skelhon who won a gold for GB in Beijing.

One of the main aims of Disability Target Shooting Great Britain is to develop links with able-bodied shooters and governing bodies. This is achieved by disabled shooters competing in able-bodied shoots and by involving able bodied coaches in the training of disabled shooters.

Getting Started / Equipment

To get started it's usually a good idea to find decent second hand equipment whilst trying out what else is available. As you improve you can

obtain additional items. Pistol shooters need no special clothing, whereas Air Rifle shooters may need a leather jacket and gloves.

The DTSGB can get you started and give you good advice. It even has a stock of equipment available for members or visitors to borrow by prior arrangement, so don't feel you can't visit due to a lack of equipment.

Getting Into Competitions

Once you have learned the basics of shooting, the world of competitions opens up. Disabled shooters may take part in able-bodied matches up to National level. International competition is restricted to disabled championships. The GB team travels all over the world to try to bring credit to the sport - and of course win some medals!

2009 Successes

At the end of April Britain's top disability shooters returned from the IPC Shooting Open Championships Jikji Cup in Korea, with a team gold and two individual bronze medals. Fifteen nations took part. The 5-strong squad included **Nathan Milgate of Herne Bay.**

(Photo right). This competition was the first time GB entered a team contest at a major international event. In May a squad of 10 including Nathan, flew to Bodrum for the Turkish Cup, and the team later competed in Bad Orb, Germany, chalking up more successes.
