Princess Christian's Farm respite flat is now fully open and many of our service users have already enjoyed overnight stays. Its quaint setting is very appealing and the thought of waking up with the animals just outside makes it a unique experience.

The layout of the flat offers full accessibility and the bathroom has a large walk in shower allowing service users to be as independent as possible.

The flat has been finished to a very high standard with a contemporary farm design and is well equipped to provide a home from home experience. It has two double bedrooms and the kitchen is fully functional with everything you need to cook a lovely meal. A cosy fire in the lounge gives the place a very homely feel.

Our staff who are both familiar and knowledgeable around individual needs are available to make respite a positive and enjoyable experience, providing a much needed break for parents and carers to recharge. Hours of respite are between 4pm – 10am or 7pm – 10am.


It is worth noting that the venue is cashless and booking will need to be done in advance on line
